

Holy Trinity and St. Matthias Church - Annual Accounts for 2013

Background

Holy Trinity and St. Matthias Church PCC has responsibility for co-ordinating with the incumbent, in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has maintenance responsibilities for the Parish Church complex of Holy Trinity and St. Matthias Church.

The Church, which is a Grade II listed building, is located at Trinity Rise, London SW2 2QP in the Diocese of Southwark. The Church is in the Brockwell Park conservation area.

Membership

Members of the PCC are either ex officio or elected by the Annual Parochial Church Meeting ("APCM") in accordance with the Church Representation Rules. At the APCM held on the 27th April 2008, a resolution was passed in accordance with the provisions of the Churchwardens Measure 2001, to waive the 6 consecutive year limitation period for service as churchwarden with regard to the Parish of Holy Trinity & St Matthias.

In accordance with new Diocesan Constitution arrangements, there has been facility for 12 elected members from the APCM 2005, nine in respect of the first 100 names on the electoral roll, and a further three in respect of the next hundred (or part thereof). The maximum number permitted is 15 where electoral roll exceeds 200 names. The full PCC met eight times during the year with an average attendance of 66%. Ministry Leaders were in attendance at one of the meetings. The Standing Committee has not needed to meet since 2011.

Charity Commission

The Parochial Church Council is a registered charity. The PCC were entered in the Register of Charities on the 28th January 2010 – **No 1133884**. All PCC members operate as Trustees.

Committees

The PCC operates through the standing committee, which meets between full meetings of the PCC as and when required to discuss matters of urgency.

Standing Committee:

This is the only committee required by law. It has the power to transact the business of the PCC between its meetings subject to any directions given by the Council.

Funds

The PCC operates six distinct funds directly. Income received by the PCC will only be restricted if it has been given or paid to the PCC for a specific purpose.

Main Fund

The main fund provides resources and raises income for the normal day to day running costs of the Church building and to promote the Church mission in the Parish of Holy Trinity and St. Matthias Church and is comprised of a Trust fund and General fund.

Building Fund

The Building Fund provides income for the upkeep of the church building including repairs, redecoration and enhancements to the church structure.

Phase IV Fund

The Phase IV Appeal Fund provides income for the revised building plans using a straw bale construction. Our initial fundraising target is £380,000, which is the equivalent of 95,000 straw bales.

Youth Ministry Fund

Originally, the Parish Youth Worker Fund which was run in connection with the work of one PCC full-time employee who left on the 31st August 2011. The Fund is now used for the work involved with Youth Ministry.

'Imagine' Family Community Workers Fund

The Imagine Family Community Workers Fund is run in connection with the work of two PCC part-time employees, namely Aileen Garden and Jacky Sutcliffe who were originally appointed with effect from the 1st March 2005 and who with effect from the 1st January, 2012 work 5 hours and 7 hours per week respectively. The project office is located in the Community Flat, 14, Saxonfield Close, Upper Tulse Hill, SW2 2UN.

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) Fund

CAP is a national charity reaching out to those who are struggling with severe debt problems. It operates through a network of centres based in churches nationwide. The Parochial Church Council entered into a partnership with CAP from the 16th September 2008 & consequently, the PCC employed a Centre Manager, namely Irene Rothwell who worked 22.5 hours per week from that date. The hours were subsequently reduced to 15 hours per week from the 13th May 2013 and then to 6.5 hours per week from the 30th September 2013. It should be noted that Irene retired on the 31st December 2013.

From the 13th May 2013, the PCC also employed a Debt Coach, namely Vanessa Reuter-Shafeek for 7.5 hours per week which were subsequently increased to 16 hours with effect from the 30th September 2013. It should be noted that Vanessa was appointed CAP Centre Manager with effect from the 1st January 2014 working 16.5 hours per week.

In addition two other funds are included in these accounts:

The War Memorial Fund, is administered by the Diocese of Rochester and Southwark acting as custodian trustee on behalf of the PCC. The PCC are entitled to the use of income from this fund.

The Vicars Discretionary Fund is now included as a regular part of these accounts and is selfexplanatory.

Church Attendance

In 2013, **124** parishioners were on the newly prepared Church Electoral Roll, of which **79** were not resident in the Parish. Please note that the electoral roll is not a true indication of church attendance.

<u>Auditor</u>

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting held in April 2013 appointed W E S Newton & Co (Accountants) to be the Auditor for the 2013 accounts.

Our new Mission Statement which was agreed in February 2011 is displayed in the church, and is given a high priority – "Our aim is to be channels of God's transforming love".

Finance Report for 2013

Main Fund (Unrestricted)

In 2013 expenditure exceeded income by £12,930. This was largely due to substantially increased contributions to the Diocese, a full year's rent for our Curate's house, increased heating bills over the severe winter, and reduced levels of overall unrestricted income to our main fund.

Income from Offertory and Donations for the Main Fund (Unrestricted)

Gift Aid and general donations including CAF donations amounted to £71,147. However, we must remember and acknowledge that during 2013 our fellowship were once again invited, on top of everything else, to make donations towards to running costs of the Imagine Family Community Project, Christians Against Poverty Project, Phase IV Appeal Fund and various other special causes.

Other income received in 2013 amounted to £26,320 which included £14,069 tax refund and a legacy of £2,271 - The overall total unrestricted income therefore amounted to £97,467.

The total Main Fund income (Unrestricted and Restricted) amounted to £139,534 which included £8,293 for Missionary causes (See page 12).

Expenditure for the Main Fund (Unrestricted and Restricted)

Expenditure in 2013 amounted to £110,397 which included major items of £56,446 for the Diocesan Quota, £27,522 for church running expenses, £8,829 for PCC tithing (see page 11), £4,831 for the Curate's Housing Costs and £2,871 for Crèche and Sunday School activities (Trinity Kids).

Total Main Fund expenditure (Unrestricted and Restricted) amounted to £152, 546.

Building Fund (Restricted)

The balance of the fund at the 31^{st} December 2013 amounted to £29,006. Income for the year amounted to £10,897 which comprised of Gift Aid donation of £8,000, Gift Day of £897 and a tax refund of £2,000. Expenditure amounted to £33,669, the major item being £27,840 for the purchase and installation of new gas boiler heating units in the main church auditorium.

Phase IV Fund (Restricted)

The balance of the Fund at the 31st December 2013 amounted to £65,257. Income for the year amounted to £11,798 and expenditure amounted to £366.

Youth Ministry Fund (Restricted)

The balance of Funds at the 31st December 2013 amounted to £5,838.

Imagine Community Project (Restricted)

The balance at the 31^{st} December 2013 amounted to £10,914. Total income for 2013 amounted to £16,628 comprised of Gift Aid, general donations including CAF donations of £6,023, a tax refund of £485, a legacy of £3,000 and grants of £7,120. Total expenditure amounted to £13,584 of which salary and associated costs totalling £12,547 were the major items.

Christians Against Poverty Centre (Restricted)

The balance at the 31^{st} December 2013 amounted to £17,769. Total income for 2013 amounted to £32,287 which comprised of Gift Aid and general donations including CAF of £20,445, Gift Day of £852 tax refund of £1,990 and a legacy of £9,000. Total expenditure amounted to £21,367 comprised of salary and associated costs totalling £13,425 & CAP(H/Q) administration fees of £6,000 were the major items.

ACTS 435 (Restricted)

Acts 435 is a revolutionary website that allows people from all parts of the country to give money directly to others who are in urgent need. The service is managed through a network of churches and donations are given quickly to those in need. The PCC is part of the network having signed up in January 2011. In 2013, £12,480 was received and paid out to 112 people in severe financial need.

In conclusion, the PCC wish to thank everyone who gave so generously throughout the year.

N.B. – Restricted Funds; Income received by the PCC will only be restricted if it has been given or paid to the PCC for a specific purpose.

Notes the Accounts for the Year Ended 31st December 2013

1. Accounting Policies continued

Activities directly relating to the work of the Church

The diocesan quota or parish share is accounted for when payable. Any quota unpaid at the calendar year end is provided for in these accounts as an operational (though not legal) liability and is shown as a creditor in the Balance Sheet.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated property and movable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the accounts by section 92(2) (a) of the Charities Act 1993.

Fixtures, fittings and Office equipment

Equipment used within Church premises is depreciated on a straight-line basis over four years. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of $\pounds 1,000$ or less are written off when required.

Investments

Investments are valued at market value at 31 December 2013.

Current Assets

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31 December in respect of fees, rent or other income are shown in debtors less provision for amounts that may prove uncollectible.

4. Investments and Tangible Fixed Assets

(a) Investments

£548.15 of 3.50% War Loan stock is included in the books of the Main Fund. Total value at 31^{st} December 2013 = £442.33.

The War Memorial Fund holds 69 units in the M&G Charity Fund. There is no record of the cost to the fund at the time they were acquired.

£1,526.58 is held in investment accounts with the CBFCE on behalf of the Main Fund of the PCC.

The Vicars Discretionary Fund holds 412 units in the H. Reed fund and 81 shares in Hemmings Trust. These investments are recorded in the books of the PCC; there is no record of the cost to the PCC of either investment. Total value at 31^{st} December $2013 = \pounds 5,458.80$.
